



## **Certification for the Future**

But practice has changed significantly!





























## CME Evolving for the Future

- Updated CME Guide for 2019-21 (http://osteopathic.org/cme/cme-guide/)
- H-220 approved at 2019 HOD allows a requirement for specialty-specific content in CME for recertification/continuing certification.


- Allows CME credit for
  Residency and fellowship
  Exams taken for board certification
  Unlimited hours of life support classes
- 120 hours of CME per cycle now required for diplomates holding non-time-limited certification
